So much of the history of Kentucky can be found at the Kentucky Historical Society's Complex made up of the Thomas D. Clark Center for Kentucky History, the Old State Capitol and the Kentucky Military History Museum.

The hours of operation of the KHS Library are Tuesday through Saturday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The museum is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Why not make plans to come to Frankfort in advance of the seminar for research? The KHS library has over 80,000 books, 6,000 oral history interviews, 10,000 reels of microfilm, rare publications and over 10,000 historic photographs. Do not overlook the Kentucky Department of Libraries and Archives on Coffee Tree Road which is open Monday through Friday.

Downtown Frankfort offers a variety of shops, bookstores, and eating places, all within walking distance of the Kentucky History Center.

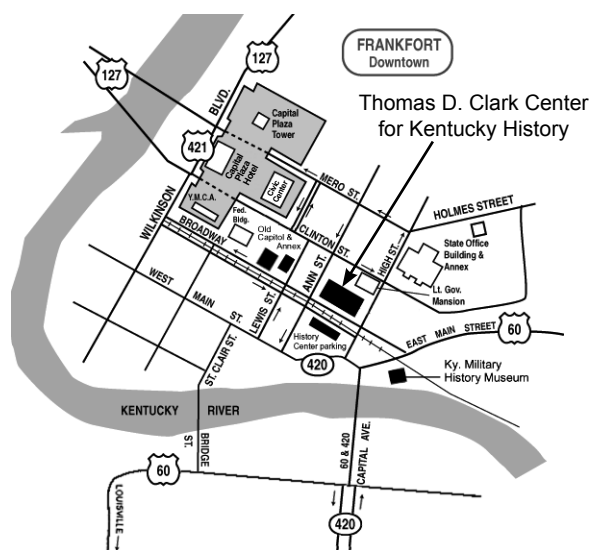
